Vine and Branches

Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine; you are the branches.

John 15:4-8

In the Willamette Valley vineyards, “bud break” is the first sign that the vines are awakening from their winter slumber. As the developing buds start to swell, they emerge still wearing their winter coats. The woolly material that protects them from cold gives them the appearance some call “teddy bear ears.” The growing shoot eventually pushes the brown wool off to reveal the bud and with the sun’s warming rays, the vine branches grow.

Two years ago, in the spring of 2022, a dangerous frost killed many of the first buds that had emerged. Vineyard managers were deeply concerned that the vintage would be completely lost or produce significantly less fruit at harvest.

In the next months, after crews went through the vineyards and pruned to encourage second buds to emerge and flourish, these vine branches miraculously produced an optimal number of berries and an abundant harvest. I have recently tasted wines from vintage 2022 and can report that they are delicious. God is good!

Abide in Me

In this week’s Gospel, Jesus implores the disciples to, “*Remain in me, as I remain in you.*” Other translations use the phrase “*abide in me*”—describing an indwelling or intimate connection. The Lord desires an intimate dwelling within each of us so that we might produce and bear much fruit. The vine branches of the 2022 vintage described above were able to yield a rich harvest, because they were still connected to the source vine, the root stock, their source of life and nourishment.

In the same way, we need to stay “connected” to the source of our life—available to us in each celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist. As branches of the True Vine, we are subject to many perils, dangers, and challenges as we do our best to grow and yield good fruit. There will be pruning in our life. We should expect it. But if we *abide in love*, we are connected to a community of believers who share our circumstance and all that surrounds us. Just as a branch cannot grow on its own apart from the vine, so too we cannot grow as individuals apart from Jesus and the community. But if we remain connected, we too can come to be an excellent vintage.



Care for Creation – An Act of Faith

This week we celebrated the 54th Anniversary of Earth Day—a time to reflect on how we can better care for our environment and the natural world. We show our respect for the Creator—the author of all life—by our stewardship of all creation.

Care for the earth and the natural world is an act of faith. As one of the seven foundational principles of Catholic Social Teaching, we are called—in faith—to live in harmony with creation, understanding that the *first incarnation* of God’s indwelling was creation itself. This is the Genesis story that we hear proclaimed at the Easter vigil each year. God hovered, breathed life, formed, and created the world. God saw that it was good and placed us in stewardship of what had been created.

In these spring days, may we consider how we are branches connected to the True Vine and called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God’s creation.

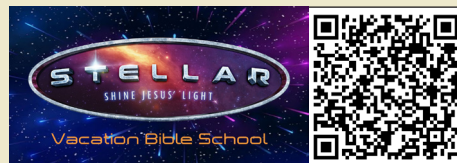

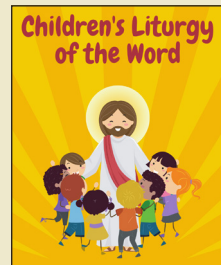

This program is available on Sundays during the 9am Mass. Children sing songs, pray together, and learn the gospel.

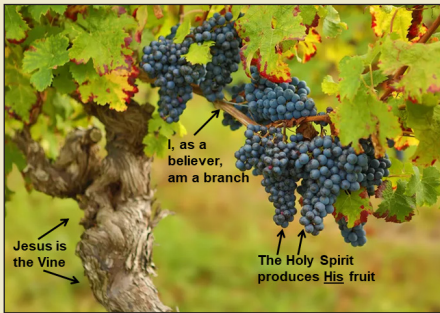

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL FOR KIDS

The Fifth Sunday of Easter

In today's Gospel Jesus says, "I am the vine, and you are the branches." Jesus is using a vineyard to help us understand our relationship with the Trinity, which is God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. A vineyard is a place where many grape vines grow. Jesus explains that God walks through the vineyard and cares for the plants by

pruning and watering them. Jesus says he is the vine which is the main part of the grape plant and we are the branches. If the branches are healthy they will produce grapes. The meaning of grapes that Jesus speaks of is actually faithfulness, generosity, patience, and kindness. Jesus wants us to understand that in order for us to produce fruit, we must be connected to him. Without Jesus in our lives, we can not become a beautiful branch full of grapes. How do we stay connected to Jesus? Through Prayer! Learn a new prayer this week such as Our Father, Glory Be, The Acts of Faith, or Hail Mary.

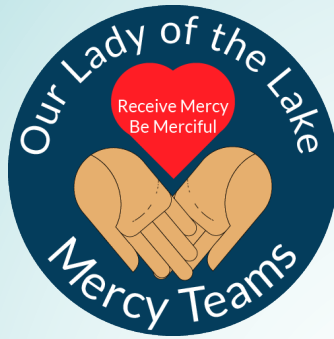

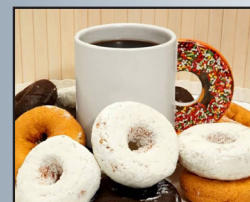

On March 26, 2024 the U.S. Supreme Court heard oral arguments in a case

that has the potential to make a major impact in the widespread accessibility of chemical abortion (abortion pills). Chemical abortions are now the most common form of abortion in the United States.

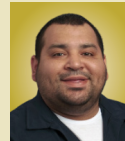
