
THE COMMUNION RITE

All: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.



Peace be to you and grace from Him Who freed us from our sins, Who loved us all and shed His blood That we might saved be.



BLESSING OF AN ADVENT WREATH

The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord. Response (R): Who made heaven and earth.

Then the Scripture is read: Isaiah 9, lines 1–2 and 5–6; or Isaiah 63, lines 16–17 & 19; or Isaiah 64, lines 2–7.

Reader: **The Word of the Lord.** Response: **Thanks be to God.**

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God,
let your blessing come upon us
as we light the candles of this wreath.
May the wreath and its light
be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.
May he come quickly and not delay.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Response: Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind; bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
