TRIDUUM

The Sacred Paschal Triduum, three days of the passion and resurrection of the Lord, is the summit of the liturgical year.

The Triduum includes the liturgies of Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday Passion of the Lord, Saturday's Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, leading to Easter Sunday of The Resurrection of the Lord. The liturgies are connected. The procession that closes the Holy Thursday Mass leads to the simple beginning of Good Friday. Welcoming the newly baptized in the Easter Vigil prepares us for the joys of Easter Sunday of the Resurrection.

We celebrate the Paschal Mystery (Jesus' death and resurrection) in our lives and in the life of the Church. Our worship through liturgical signs and sacraments unites us to Christ in intimate communion. We remember our conversion of heart, the Holy Spirit present in our lives, and our mission as Christian disciples.

EVENING MASS

With this Mass, which recalls the Last Supper, the Church begins the Sacred Paschal Triduum.

The mysteries that are commemorated in this Mass are the institution of the Eucharist, the institution of the priesthood, and Christ's command of love, ministry and service to one another.

The washing of feet represents the service and charity of Jesus, who came "not to be served, but to serve."

RECEPTION OF THE HOLY OILS AND SACRED CHRISM

The Chrism Mass was celebrated this year on April 14th at St. Mary's Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Portland. Three holy oils, each with a specific purpose, were prepared for use in all parishes in the diocese for this next year.

The first oil is blessed for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

The Oil of Catechumens is blessed for anointing catechumens.

The Sacred Chrism is consecrated for the anointing in the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.







The procession is led by the Cross Bearer, followed by the Candle Bearers and Thurifer, the Deacon, the Priests with the Blessed Sacrament, the Choir, the Catechumens and the First Communion children with their family members. All are invited to follow behind the First Communion families in the procession. If you do not wish to join the procession, please remain in your pew until the procession has exited the Church, and then depart in silence. You may spend time in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 11pm.
